GICC UTSAV 2009, an evening to celebrate arts at GIIS

GICC Utsav 2009, the annual cultural extravaganza of the Global Indian Cultural Centre was celebrated at the GIIS Queenstown auditorium on 29th Nov. Around 225 GICC students showcased their talents thorough various art forms like Dance, Vocal and Instrumental music, Drama & Languages.

The **Guest of Honour Mr N G Vasanth Kumar, First Secretary,High Commission of India to Singapore** lit the lamp to signify an auspicious beginning for the programme along with dignitaries like Mr Atul Temurnikar, Chairman, GIF, Mr Maneesh Tripathi, CEO, GIF, Mr Kaustubh Bodhankar, Country Director GIIS Singapore, Mr GSS Rao, Principal- GIIS Queenstown, Vice Principals Ms. Meenakshi and Ms. Melissa Maria. During the lighting of the lamp students from the **Shloka chanting** group added good luck by chanting shlokas in unison. The evening programme was helmed very competently by Nikita, Sagarika and Vaishali who as comperes, kept the audience informed about the various performances.

Performances for the evening were:

- The Keyboard students presented Sargam, Mani Iyer's composition in Bilabel, Varnam and Keerthanam.
- The GICC Coordinator, Ms Latha Pradeep presented a detailed GICC annual report for the year 2009.
- Budding vocalists and instrumentalists performed as a well-matched Indian Orchestra.
- Carnatic Vocal students along with budding violinists presented **Dheera Shankarabharanam**. It is the 29th Melakarta Ragam in Carnatic music followed by a Thukkada Madumeikkum Kanne. The spirit and enthusiasm of both the groups, as Mother Yasodha and Krishna was evident in their excellent performance.
- A small skit and a song were presented by students of Malayalam Language class.
- Hindustani vocal and Carnatic vocal students accompanied by tabla and mridangam students presented Jugalbandi in a Sawal Javaab style. The Carnatic vocal students sang in Ragam Mohanam set to Adi Thalam composed by Sri Thyagaraja and Hindustani students presented a traditional composition in Raag Bhoopali, the counterpart of Raag Mohanam in Carnatic music. This way the audience enjoyed the flavours of both Carnatic and Hindustani Music.
- French Language class students presented a small skit which gave an insight into their efficiency in speaking a foreign language.
- Students of Hindustani Vocal music accompanied by GICC tabla students performed few basic exercises followed by a traditional composition in Raag Yaman and Kafi. .
- Nanhe Munne friends from the Hindi class presented an action song, which took most of the audience down the memory lane with their sincere and patriotic rendition.

Moving away from music, the speech & drama students presented a skit – **The Three Billy Goats Gruff**.

- India's cultural heritage encompasses various classical dance forms which have enthralled audiences the world over with their grace, beauty and intricate steps.
